FUSING, PAINTING, AND STITCHING TO CREATE ART QUILTS

Our guild is lucky to have snagged **Lenore Crawford** as our speaker and workshop instructor this month! Lenore is a nationally known quilt artist and the winner of many prestigious awards for her work over the years, including this year's second place win in the Innovative category at the Denver National Quilt Festival VIII for her quilt "Capturing Brittany." (see her work at www.lenorecrawford.com) She has taught seminars and workshops all over the world, this year alone at Empty Spools in Monterey, the National Quilt Museum in Paducah, and the Taupo Symposium in New Zealand. She has also been featured in exhibitions across the US and Europe, and has taught at symposiums in Spain and France. (Some she even taught in French!) Her work has appeared in books and magazines worldwide, including being featured on a number of magazine covers. We are so excited to have her come to Folsom to inspire us and to teach a workshop on creating a shredded fabric impressionistic art quilt.

In her presentation, she will share the fusing, fabric painting, and stitching techniques that she uses to create art quilts with depth and color from photos she has taken in her travels. She will tell how she creates a piece from beginning to end and gives secrets on how to make your design a winner.

In the workshop, she will teach us to create our own shredded fabric impressionistic art quilt using a technique originated by Noriko Endo. Fabrics are shredded in class and used to design a scene with depth and detail. Then the design is covered in tulle and top-stitched using free-motion sewing, and embellished with touches of fabric paint.

(Please note that there is a \$10 kit fee, payable to Valerie at the workshop.)

Guild Challenges Due November 12

Here are the four challenges—something for everyone! More info is on our website. Register your name with the challenge chair, named below. Some challenges need to be completed a bit earlier than November 12, for judging.

Machine Embroidery – Depict this year's theme “Walk on the Wild Side” in an original or purchased machine embroidery design. The design must cover a pillow insert of 14” x 14” inches. Ask Claudia Norman for details.

Miniature Quilt – “Walk on the Wild Side” theme and maximum size of 18” x 18”. Must include one visible 45-degree diamond. Helen Hardwick.

Wearable Art Challenge – \$10 kits include a fat quarter of cotton taupe with black dots, a 6” strip of cotton in pale taupe with silver sparkles, and a yard of silver ribbon to create “Wild at Heart.” Use some fabric weaving also. Jeannie Trojan.

Bed Runner Challenge – A long, narrow quilt that accents the foot of your bed. The bed runner's width must be between 20” – 34” and you decide the length to fit your bed size. Deb Winterling.

(Art Quilt Challenges are not due in November.)

Board Meeting Minutes

Tuesday, July 9, 2013



Take a trip to Washington, D.C. in October to see a Quilts of Honor Show to be held October 4-6 at the National Museum of the Marine Corps.



**Anne, 2014 Quilt Show Chairperson****Here are the categories...**

- #1 Miniature Quilt – Quilt must be miniature in scale and 580 sq. in. or less.
- #2 Appliquéd Quilt – A quilt of any size that is predominately (more than 50%) hand- or machine-appliquéd by maker.
- #3 Pieced Quilt – A quilt of any size that is predominately (more than 50%) hand- or machine-pieced.
- #4 Innovative Quilt – A non-traditional quilt of any size that brings something new to quilting such as idea or method, fabric, embellishment, surface design.
- #5 Mixed Techniques – A quilt of any size using multiple techniques such as embroidery and piecing, pieced background with appliqué on top, mixed pieced and appliqué blocks.
- #6 Art Quilt – A quilt of any size that extensively uses non-traditional techniques to show originality in theory, design, color and/or technique to be used as a piece of art.
- #7 Specialty Quilt – A quilt of any size with construction that does not fit into the above categories. Examples: Cathedral Window, T-Shirt, Photo/Memory, Whole Cloth, Yo-Yo.
- #8 Group Quilt – A quilt of any size, where the TOP was created by two or more people who together worked on design, construction or finishing in any way or any combination thereof.

MORE →

- #9 Youth Quilt – A quilt of any size that is made by anyone under the age of 18 years. Youth quilts will be evaluated by the judges as a courtesy of the Guild.
- #10 Art Quilt Guild Challenge – See Challenge rules.
- #11 Other Fiber Item – Includes dolls, cross stitchery, knitted/crocheted items, silk ribbon embroidery, tatting, etc.
- #12 Quilted Home Accessory – Includes quilted items for the home, such as bed runners, table runners, placemats, pillows.
- #13 Wearable Art Garment – Artistic expression in clothing using traditional quilting techniques, other wearable art techniques and embellishments that result in a one-of-a-kind garment. The class includes altered/repurposed garments.
- #14 Wearable Art Accessory – Purses, bags, hats, scarfs, socks, mittens, earrings, belts, brooches, containers.
- If a large number of entries are received in one class, the class may be divided into sub-classes by size.

### *Which Category Does My Quilt Belong In?*

#### **Instructions:**

- Determine the size of your quilt, then start at the top of the list.  
As long as you answer “NO” to each question, keep going down the numbered questions.  
If you answer “YES”, there may be lettered questions to narrow the definition of the class.  
Read the definitions CAREFULLY.

To determine the square inches (sq. in.) multiply the “side-to-side” dimension, in inches, by the “top-to-bottom” dimension, in inches.

Examples: (side by side or “width”) 18 in. X (top to bottom or “length”) 24 in. = 432 sq. in.  
(side by side or “width”) 48 in. X (top to bottom or “length”) 48 in. = 2304 sq. in.

Your turn:

(side by side or “width”) \_\_\_\_\_ X (top to bottom or “length”) \_\_\_\_\_ = \_\_\_\_\_ sq. in.

- Was the item entered in the Art Quilt Guild Challenge and does it follow the theme and size guidelines?  
(If not, it can still be entered in category #6.) #10 Art Quilt Guild Challenge
- Is the item something other than a quilt?
  - Is the item a Wearable Art Garment or Ensemble? #13 Wearable Art Garment
  - Is the item a Wearable Art Accessory? #14 Wearable Art Accessory
  - Is the item a Home Accessory? #12 Quilted Home Accessory
  - Is the item any other fiber item? #11 Other Fiber Item
- Is the maker of the entry less than 18 years of age? #9 Youth Quilt
- Is the item miniature in scale and smaller than 580 sq. ins? #1 Miniature Quilt
- Was the quilt top constructed by more than one person? #8 Group Quilt
- Is the item designed to be used as a piece of art? #6 Art Quilt
- Is the quilt designed to be used on a bed, lap or crib?
  - Is the quilt non-traditional? #4 Innovative Quilt
  - Is the quilt predominately hand or machine appliquéd? #2 Appliquéd Quilt
  - Is the quilt predominately hand or machine pieced? #3 Pieced Quilt
  - Is the quilt made using a combination of techniques? #5 Mixed Technique
  - Is the quilt made using other techniques that do not fit in any of the above? #7 Specialty Technique

## 2014 Quilt Show Entry Form Deadline: Sunday, December 1, 2013

**Deliver entries to the Folsom Community Center, Wednesday, Feb. 5, 2014 between 7:00 and 9:00 a.m.**

### RULES

1. FQFG members may enter quilts, wearable art, and other fiber items that they have made or have participated in making.
2. A member may also **sponsor**, for exhibit only, **one item** made or owned by a non-member.
3. Entries may not have been shown previously in a FQFG Show.
4. All quilts must be quilted, not tied. Exception: Cathedral Window, Yo-Yo, Historical Reproductions and Youth quilts.
5. Maximum number of judged entries per person is **two in any one class**, up to a **total of four** items across all classes.  
**EXCEPTION:** Members may enter an additional entry in the **art quilt challenge** for a **total of 5 items**.
6. The number of entries may need to be limited due to hall size.
7. An item may be reassigned to a more appropriate class after review of the entry form or by request of judges.
8. A member may enter items either for **Exhibit Only** or for **Professional Judging**.
  - a. Exhibit Only may be of any vintage. There is no fee to enter these entries.
  - b. Professional Judging is not available for sponsored entries.
  - c. Member must have completed the entries for Professional Judging within the past three (3) years.
  - d. There is a \$10.00 fee for each judged entry.
  - e. Youth entries will receive judges' comments at no charge.
9. Each quilt/entry will be insured at a value of \$500.00.
10. **A legible completed entry form and photo of the entry is required for each entry. Entries submitted without a photo will not be accepted. Also, please enclose a photo of the maker or exhibitor not to exceed 3 1/2" X 5" to:**


