Tuesday, June 11, 2013

Welcome and Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by President Becky Zsoka. The agenda was approved.

Treasurer's report, Sherry Hammer: The budget for 2013/14 has been revised. The revised budget will be presented tonight to the General membership for approval.

Old Business

The by-laws committee met and has begun the review of the current by-laws and policies of the guild. The by-laws are reviewed every three years. The by-laws committee asks that we read the current by-laws printed in the back of your 2012 roster and forward questions to one of the committee members: Becky Zsoka, Helen Hardwick, Derald Langwell, or Donna Brennan.

New Business:

Education Chairperson Dana Lahargoue presented 3 applications for the guild annual scholarship awards. The applicants are Skylar Phillips, 9 yrs; Isabella Sherman, 10 yrs; and Ellie Pellegrini, 10 yrs. The motion was made and carried to grant each applicant a \$250.00 scholarship.

JULY 9-10 Member Demonstrations, then a workshop by Judy Sisneros – Circle Pizzazz

Seven members of our guild will demo various quilting techniques for us, including thread information, as well as embellishment, stitching and beading techniques so that everyone can learn something new!

FQFG member Judy Sisneros will conduct a workshop based on her new book, Circle Pizzazz. Acrylic template kits are available so that you can do some cutting before the workshop. Check out her website at www.judysisneros.com. Add your name to this waiting list by calling Denise.

AUGUST 13-14: Lenore Crawford – Fusing, Painting, and Stitching to Create Art Quilts

Lenore will share the fusing, fabric painting and stitching techniques that she uses to create art quilts with depth and color from her travel photos, as well as her secrets on how to make a design a winner. Check out her work at <http://www.lenorecrawford.com/index.htm>

In the August 14 workshop, Lenore will teach us how to create shredded fabric impressionistic art quilts. Working from one of your own photos you will create a piece from shredded fabric, learn to free motion topstitch it, and accent it with paint.

SEPTEMBER 10-11: Valerie Goodwin – Maps and Architecture, with Trunk Show

Valerie is a practicing architect and an associate professor at Florida A&M, teaching architectural design classes, and she will talk with us about how she incorporates the symbols and language found in maps and architectural drawings into her award-winning quilted artwork. She will also

present a trunk show of her work, which has been widely published and exhibited across the nation, including at Quilt National and Visions. Her book, *Art Quilt Maps: Capture a Sense of Place with Fiber Collage – A Visual Guide*, will be released on September 1.

There is a \$10 kit fee for her “Favorite Places” workshop. Valerie will guide you into translating *your* map, be it a real place or an imaginary one, into an abstract piece that characterizes your individual vision. She will consult with each workshop participant prior to the workshop to help focus and prepare ideas and enable each of us to benefit from the one-day workshop. Her website, www.quiltsbyvalerie.com is an amazing source of ideas and inspiration!

OCTOBER 8-9: Sandy Wagner – My Life as a Fabric Dyer

Sandy has been an accomplished fabric dye artist for many years, creating and teaching others how to create stunning dyed silk, wearable art, and quilted pieces. Her work has been featured in a number of books, has won many awards, and is featured in a number of galleries and private collections. She will share with us her insights into the dye process, discussing batiks, shibori, natural fabrics and more.

Sandy will teach us to create silk-screened designs that we will be able to use over and over in our work. Each workshop participant can bring several Xeroxed designs, which may be clip art, symbols, or photos, as long as it is not too detailed. Details are provided on the supply list on the guild website. Using a thermofax machine, we will create silk screens and learn to transfer the design with paint onto our fabrics. The supply fee is \$13.

Anne, 2014 Quilt Show Chairperson

Here are the categories...

- #1 Miniature Quilt – Quilt must be miniature in scale and 580 sq. in. or less.
- #2 Appliquéd Quilt – A quilt of any size that is predominately (more than 50%) hand- or machine-appliquéd by maker.
- #3 Pieced Quilt – A quilt of any size that is predominately (more than 50%) hand- or machine-pieced.
- #4 Innovative Quilt – A non-traditional quilt of any size that brings something new to quilting such as idea or method, fabric, embellishment, surface design.
- #5 Mixed Techniques – A quilt of any size using multiple techniques such as embroidery and piecing, pieced background with appliqué on top, mixed pieced and appliqué blocks.
- #6 Art Quilt – A quilt of any size that extensively uses non-traditional techniques to show originality in theory, design, color and/or technique to be used as a piece of art.
- #7 Specialty Quilt – A quilt of any size with construction that does not fit into the above categories. Examples: Cathedral Window, T-Shirt, Photo/Memory, Whole Cloth, Yo-Yo.
- #8 Group Quilt – A quilt of any size, where the TOP was created by two or more people who together worked on design, construction or finishing in any way or any combination thereof.

MORE →

- #9 Youth Quilt – A quilt of any size that is made by anyone under the age of 18 years. Youth quilts will be evaluated by the judges as a courtesy of the Guild.
- #10 Art Quilt Guild Challenge – See Challenge rules.
- #11 Other Fiber Item – Includes dolls, cross stitchery, knitted/crocheted items, silk ribbon embroidery, tatting, etc.
- #12 Quilted Home Accessory – Includes quilted items for the home, such as bed runners, table runners, placemats, pillows.
- #13 Wearable Art Garment – Artistic expression in clothing using traditional quilting techniques, other wearable art techniques and embellishments that result in a one-of-a-kind garment. The class includes altered/repurposed garments.
- #14 Wearable Art Accessory – Purses, bags, hats, scarfs, socks, mittens, earrings, belts, brooches, containers.

If a large number of entries are received in one class, the class may be divided into sub-classes by size.

Which Category Does My Quilt Belong In?

Instructions:

- Determine the size of your quilt, then start at the top of the list.
As long as you answer “NO” to each question, keep going down the numbered questions.
If you answer “YES”, there may be lettered questions to narrow the definition of the class.
Read the definitions CAREFULLY.

To determine the square inches (sq. in.) multiply the “side-to-side” dimension, in inches, by the “top-to-bottom” dimension, in inches.

Examples: (side by side or “width”) 18 in. X (top to bottom or “length”) 24 in. = 432 sq. in.
(side by side or “width”) 48 in. X (top to bottom or “length”) 48 in. = 2304 sq. in.

Your turn:

4. All quilts must be quilted, not tied. Exception: Cathedral Window, Yo-Yo, Historical Reproductions and Youth quilts.
5. Maximum number of judged entries per person is **two in any one class**, up to a **total of four** items across all classes.
EXCEPTION: Members may enter an additional entry in the **art quilt challenge** for a **total of 5 items**.
6. The number of entries may need to be limited due to hall size.
7. An item may be reassigned to a more appropriate class after review of the entry form or by request of judges.
8. A member may enter items either for **Exhibit Only** or for **Professional Judging**.
 - a. Exhibit Only may be of any vintage. There is no fee to enter these entries.
 - b. Professional Judging is not available for sponsored entries.
 - c. Member must have completed the entries for Professional Judging within the past three (3) years.
 - d. There is a \$10.00 fee for each judged entry.
 - e. Youth entries will receive judges' comments at no charge.


