### Carrie Fondi, Traditional Hawaiian Quilting

Come with us to the beautiful islands of Hawaii, as our June speaker, Carrie Fondi, tells us all about the traditions and history of Hawaiian quilting, accompanied by a stunning trunk show of her traditional and contemporary Hawaiian quilts. Carrie, who has been a quilter since 1992, fell in love with Hawaiian quilting, which evolved in the islands in the early 1800's, and studied with master Hawaiian quilters Poakalani and John Serrao. As Hawaiian quilting became a full-time passion, she created Melia Quilts in 2010 to promote the art and create her own Hawaiian quilt patterns, designs inspired by the beauty of nature and love for the islands. In addition to sharing her passion for Hawaiian quilts, Carrie teaches many forms of appliqué throughout California and Nevada.

Carrie's workshop will induct us into the art of traditional Hawaiian quilting, cutting a block from a quarter-fold pattern, the traditional and modern Hawaiian basting methods, and needle turn appliqué the unique Hawaiian way. The class fee includes your choice of one of Carrie's 22-inch Hawaiian block patterns, and she even has some new designs available. She will also offer optional hand-dyed fabric kits in many colors for only \$15. You don't even need to bring your machine—this is a no-stress hand appliqué class! There are still a few openings in the class, so if you are interested, contact Denise Schmidt or Pam Taylor, and don't wait too long, as this class is filling fast!

Cuddle Quilts, Marilyn Long – Marilyn received 20 bolts of fleece and will put together kits. Marilyn is going to create a thermometer to display how many guild members create Cuddle Quilts to encourage more members to participate.

Boutique, Dianna Redmon and Co-Chairs Nancy Hitchcock and Joan Myers will be assisting Dianna in Boutique for the February 2014 quilt show.

Art Challenge, Penny Hanscom – Penny announced she is still open for suggestions for a theme this year. Please see Penny near the stage stairs at break.

Program, Denise Schmidt with Co-Chair Pam Taylor – Good news and bad news: The good news is that she signed up Lenore Crawford for August, who is an internationally-known quilter and her workshop is going to be on shredded fabric landscapes. The bad news is that Jean Wells has cancelled. Denise will let us know if she is going to refund the money paid for the class or if she can reschedule. Jan Soules' workshop tomorrow has 2-3 spaces available. Judy Sisneros will be the July speaker and workshop and her workshop is full. Denise advised us on how to register for classes using the website as some had a little difficulty. Also, it is very important that you pay for your class when you sign up.

Project of the Month, Susan Spicer – This month's project uses printer fabric. She has instructions and shared her project which depicted nature photos.

Quilt Show Chair, Anne Ross – Anne announced that the theme for the 2014 quilt show is "Walk on The Wild Side." The raffle quilt top is finished and should be completed by June. Anne encouraged members to get comfortable with being uncomfortable, to stretch their abilities and knowledge. The next quilt show committee meeting is set for Saturday, May 25 at Raley's in El Dorado Hills. She announced taking copious notes at the last quilt show, and she is trying to adopt some of these teachings. One of them is to reduce the number of categories. Another was to have category information available sooner. Anne and a small group have restructured the categories to suit everyone's ability as well as encourage opportunities for growth. ### EMMA ALLEBES ART QUILT CHALLENGE

**Well, Ladies and Derald, we now have a theme: "MAPS", and the ideas are endless: pirate maps, topography maps, mariner's maps, a city or street layout, someone holding a map, a book of maps, a compass, map fabric—absolutely anything that would include a map theme. This presents a great opportunity to try something new and original.**

**Rules: The quilt has a minimum size of 12-in. square and a maximum size of 40-in. square and any size (round, square, curvy, rectangular). It must be layered and finished using any method (bound, zig-zag stitched, pillowcase, etc.), labeled, and have a standard 4-in. sleeve for hanging.**

**The quilts are due and first viewed at the annual show in 2014 in Art Challenge category.**



## 2013/2014 Miniature Quilt Challenge

The miniature challenge this year is individual. One quilt = one person. Remember this is a challenge. Stretching yourself is good!

- The theme of our 2014 show will be "Walk on the Wild Side." Our raffle quilt uses nature's colors and diamond shapes.
- The miniature challenge theme will be "Wild Thing," interpreted any way you want. Wild fabric, wild colors, wild animals or ...?
- At least one visible 45 degree diamond must be included in your piecing. This may be either a diamond formed from two half square triangles OR a true equal-sided (equilateral) diamond. If you don't understand the difference, please ask.



- Each miniature quilt must finish square or rectangular. The completed miniature must be 18" x 18" or smaller. Entries larger than 18" on any side will be disqualified.
- The scale of all blocks and borders must be miniature. (If the entire quilt was enlarged to bed-size the design would remain in good proportion.) Another way to define miniature scale: you cannot easily determine from a photograph if the quilt is large or miniature.
- Miniature scale appliqué may be used in addition to the piecing.
- To be in the challenge, all miniatures are due at the November 12, 2013, meeting. That means quilted and bound with a sleeve attached. A viewers' choice award will be voted and presented at the November meeting.

You are encouraged to enter your miniature in the 2014 FQFG show.

Welcome to Folsom Quilt and Fiber Guild's 29th Annual Quilt Show, Walk on The Wild Side. The theme is two-fold, Walk on The Wild Side is about our abundant natural flora and fauna in Northern California. From the variety of trees and floral beauty to the animal and fish. Second, to stretch ourselves to new heights of creativity, learning new techniques, color palettes and getting to know someone new in our guild and beyond. Yes, get COMFORTABLE WITH BEING UNCOMFORTABLE. It is in moments of fear and anxiety, when learning something new, that stretches me to another realm that transforms me into laughter, joy and understanding. Step outside the box.

After listening to members, guests and judges from last year's show I saw some common threads that were worthy of change. Change is good, it helps us to grow and try new things. They may work, they may not, and wouldn't it be fun and exciting to see what happens when we try? I'm game. One common thread was to receive the categories earlier, to assist in your planning, so you'll find that information here. The application will be available in the fall. All the judges stated that there were too many categories, so a diligent collaborative team has fine-tuned the categories to what we believe is all-inclusive and simple. Please review the categories, ponder, go outside, play, get excited and just see what comes up for you. Our show is the best and people come from afar to see "what's new".

In reducing the number of categories to streamline judging, we looked back to the guild's early way of doing challenges. So, the Guild Challenges are due in November as usual, and will be judged according to Challenge Committee plans. You are then encouraged to enter your piece to be judged or exhibited into the 2014 Quilt Show, in the Miniature Quilt, Quilted Home Accessory, or Wearable Art categories. The only Challenge category that will be judged *as a Challenge* in the Quilt Show is the Emma Allebes Art Quilt Challenge, which is due according to Show entry timelines.

Enjoy perusing the categories and all I ask is for you to consider walking on your wild side.

*Entry Form Deadline: Sunday, December 1, 2013*

*Deliver entries to the Folsom Community Center, Wednesday, Feb. 5, 2014 between 7:00 and 9:00 a.m.*

*Maximum number of judged entries per person is two in any one class, up to a total of four items across all classes. EXCEPTION: Members may enter an additional entry in the art quilt challenge for a total of 5 items.*

### *Here are the categories...*

- #1 Miniature Quilt - Quilt must be miniature in scale and 580 sq. in. or less.
- #2 Appliquéd Quilt - A quilt of any size that is predominately (more than 50%) hand- or machine-appliquéd by maker.
- #3 Pieced Quilt - A quilt of any size that is predominately (more than 50%) hand or machine-pieced.
- #4 Innovative Quilt - A non-traditional quilt of any size that brings something new to quilting such as idea or method, fabric, embellishment, surface design.
- #5 Mixed Techniques - A quilt of any size using multiple techniques such as embroidery and piecing, pieced background with appliqué on top, mixed pieced and appliqué blocks.
- #6 Art Quilt - A quilt of any size that extensively uses non-traditional techniques to show originality in theory, design, color and/or technique to be used as a piece of art.
- #7 Specialty Quilt - A quilt of any size with construction that does not fit into the above categories. Examples: Cathedral Window, T-Shirt, Photo/Memory, Whole Cloth, Yo-Yo.
- #8 Group Quilt - A quilt of any size created by two or more people who together worked on design, construction or finishing in any way or any combination thereof.
- #9 Youth Quilt - A quilt of any size that is made by anyone under the age of 18 years. Youth quilts will be evaluated by the judges as a courtesy of the Guild.
- #10 Art Quilt Guild Challenge - See Challenge rules.
- #11 Other Fiber Item - Includes dolls, cross stitchery, knitted/crocheted items, silk ribbon embroidery, tatting, etc.
- #12 Quilted Home Accessory - Includes quilted items for the home, such as bed runners, table runners, placemats, pillows.
- #13 Wearable Art Garment - Artistic expression in clothing using traditional quilting techniques, other wearable art techniques and embellishments that result in a one-of-a-kind garment. The class includes altered/repurposed garments.
- #14 Wearable Art Accessory - Purses, bags, hats, scarfs, socks, mittens, earrings, belts, brooches, containers.

If a large number of entries are received in one class, the class may be divided into sub-classes by size.






